## **Background**

The use of linear description of sport horses for breeding purposes has become more and more common. Studbooks and individual breeders appreciate the more objective and detailed information on their horses. In the beginning, linear description was used mostly for conformation traits as well as free jumping and gaits at hand and/or in freedom. Now, linear description of traits under rider has been introduced by a number of studbooks.

While most or all of the major studbooks now have applied the linear description system in at least part of their breeding programs, challenges remain in terms of interpretation of the information across countries. Equestrian sport and sport horse breeding are international, so it is important that we get an opportunity to discuss these issues in an international context. Even if we use similar names for the traits, the definition of the traits and the meaning of the linear values assigned may differ between studbooks. Also, we have different descriptive scales and variation in what our judges consider 'average' and 'extreme' expression of the traits.









## About the workshop

At the 5<sup>th</sup> International Workshop on Linear Profiling in the Warmblood Horse, we will try to address these issues. Our aim is to improve transparency and possibly increase comparability of linear description. This time we will therefore extend a particularly warm welcome to the **people that work with the practical part of the linear profiling – the judges**. We would like to encourage all studbooks to send judges to this workshop, **along with the studbook representatives**. We have allocated more time to practical exercises in the program this year, which means we will assess horses linearly together, led by moderators. We will go through the assessment of young horses both without and with rider, and time is also allocated for discussion of the assessments.

The experience of previous years has shown that meetings of science and practice can valuably contribute to progress in the field of linear profiling in the Warmblood horse. The program therefore also includes some theory on how studbooks can work with and benefit from linear profiling in their breeding programs. Part of this is that the studbook representatives will be asked to report on advances in linear description and genetic evaluation based on linear data in their studbook. Presenting is surely optional. However, we all benefit from the open exchange on everything around linear description and the use of linear data, and the international setting is making our workshops kind of unique. So, everybody, who would like to share ideas and use the opportunity to discuss them with colleagues, may help compiling an attractive program and submit a suggestive title of her / his presentation to the organizers (contact data given below).

On behalf of the international working group on linear profiling, it is a pleasure for us to kindly invite you to the 5<sup>th</sup> International Workshop on Linear Profiling in the Warmblood Horse which will take place on Tuesday, 22<sup>nd</sup> January 2019, and Wednesday, 23<sup>rd</sup> January 2019, at Flyinge Equestrian Centre in Sweden.

Flyinge Equestrian Centre is located in the small village of Flyinge, about 10 minutes (15 km) northeast of Lund in the very south of Sweden.
